





THE CROSSROADS OF THE BAY AREA DUBLIN

Perfectly situated at the connection of two major freeways, Dublin is one of the fastest-growing cities in the United States. Along with its diverse culinary scene, the city offers shops, nightlife and recreational opportunities for fun-seekers of all ages, including golf, bowling, ice-skating, go-kart racing, and a water park and trampoline park. There's history here, too: Witness Dublin's annual St. Patrick's Day Celebration, which recognizes the Irish heritage of the city's founders. Look for shamrocks adorning street signs in honor of those early immigrants from the Emerald Isle. The city even welcomed a professional baseball team, the aptly named Dublin Leprechauns, in 2023.

RAISE A GLASS IN WINE COUNTRY

LIVERMORE

Forget Napa and Sonoma. California's oldest wine-growing region, Livermore is a world-class destination with dozens of wineries-most of which have been family owned and operated for generations. Livermore is not just for wine aficionados, though. There is a wide selection of craft breweries and trendy restaurants, along with plenty of kid-friendly attractions, including mini golf, super slides and laser tag. Livermore is also host to the annual Little League Intermediate World Series, featuring baseball all-stars, ages 11 to 13. Shoppers flock to the San Francisco Premium Outlets and specialty boutiques downtown. Sample Livermore's rich cultural offerings by catching a show at the Bankhead Theater.

WHERE SMALL-TOWN CHARM MEETS BIG-CITY STYLE

DANVILLE

Take a stroll along bustling Hartz Avenue in downtown Danville, and experience the relaxed yet polished vibe for yourself. The town's vibrant center features chic shops, regional theater productions and art shows, cosmopolitan drinking spots, and top-notch restaurants. Venture away from the hub, and you'll find cultural draws such as Tao House (the one-time residence of playwright Eugene O'Neill, where his plays live on during the annual Eugene O'Neill Festival), as well as Danville's numerous hiking trails, parks and open spaces.



COMMUNITY CULTURE

The distinctive culture of the Tri-Valley area dates back centuries. Its history, filled with frontierspeople and immigrants, has fostered a unique spirit of local pride, collaboration and innovation that lives on to this day.

HISTORY COMES ALIVE

IN THE TRI-VALLEY, EVERYTHING IS DEEPLY CONNECTED TO THE PAST.

Historical insights can be gleaned in every town throughout the Tri-Valley. For instance, the **Dublin Heritage Park & Museums** is a 10-acre area that is home to **Pioneer Cemetery**; **Old St. Raymond Church**, built in 1859; the **Murray Schoolhouse Museum**; and the **Kolb House**, a 1910 Craftsman bungalow that now operates as a museum. **Dublin Camp Parks Military History Center** preserves the old military base, which was known as Fleet City during World War II.

In Danville, an oak tree thought to be more than 350 years old stands on Diablo Road, and its likeness serves as the town's logo. The historic 1891 **Southern Pacific Railroad Depot** nearby houses **MuseumSRV**.

In Pleasanton, sign up for a historical walking tour with **Museum on Main**. Don't miss **Alviso Adobe**, a community park that offers a rich interpretive history of the Amador Valley, from its Native American roots to the present day.

Even the wines in Livermore are steeped in tradition. **Wente Vineyards**, which started in 1883, produced the first labeled chardonnay, sauvignon blanc and semillon in the country. Today, most of the chardonnay grapes in California descend from Wente clones. **Concannon Vineyard**, founded the same year, made one of the first Bordeaux-style wines in the state.

BRIGHT IDEAS

LIVERMORE, HOME TO THE SMARTEST SQUARE MILE ON EARTH, IS WHERE YOU WILL FIND GROUNDBREAKING NEW CONCEPTS AND HISTORIC ARTIFACTS.

There have been many great achievements rooted in the Tri-Valley over the years, but one of the biggest might be the first-ever demonstration of controlled nuclear fusion ignition by **Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory** (LLNL), often called the smartest square mile on earth.

The breakthrough took place at the Livermore-based National Ignition Facility late at night on December 5, 2022, and within days, the moment made headlines around the globe. Secretary of Energy Jennifer M. Granholm called it "one of the most impressive scientific feats of the 21st century." The effort is a key step on the journey toward limitless clean energy.

LLNL is a federally funded research and development center that was initially established in 1952. Today, the lab continues to be at the forefront of nuclear advancements and security, along with cutting-edge ideas across a variety of other scientific fields. Visitors can get an inside look at its work at the Discovery Center (see page 45 for more). *llnl.gov*

Coincidentally, Livermore is also the site of the planet's longest-burning light bulb, according to Guinness World Records. This humble bulb—nicknamed the **Centennial Light Bulb**—can be seen at Livermore Fire Station 6 on East Avenue. It was first turned on in 1901 and has been switched off only a few times in the ensuing years. Originally a 60-watt light, it's dimmed but still hanging on at 4 watts. Visitors are welcome, depending on the availability of firefighters to let them inside; the bulb is also visible through one of the station's windows. *centennialbulb.org*



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BREAKFAST OF CHAMPIONS

THERE'S NO BETTER WAY TO START YOUR DAY THAN WITH A DELICIOUS, ENERGIZING MEAL AT ONE OF THESE TRI-VALLEY RESTAURANTS.

THE CLASSICS

The Riata Diner & Tavern in Livermore reflects the area's pioneer past with Wild West-inspired decor and memorabilia—and serves hearty breakfast dishes. For more quirky furnishings and no-frills food, check out Jim's Country Style Restaurant in Pleasanton. The popular diner (there can be a line at the door on weekends) features wood-paneled walls, street signs as art and mouthwatering all-day breakfast items.

Monica's Livermore, located in a historic building, offers generously portioned breakfasts, including French toast made with house-baked bread. Consider having your meal on the spacious outdoor patio.

Follow the locals to Danville's **Sideboard Neighborhood Kitchen and Coffee Bar**, a premier cafe that features great food and brands such as Sightglass, Temple Coffee Roasters and more. **Crumbs Breakfast, Lunch & Bar** is another Danville gathering place that is popular with all ages. Fill up on sizable plates, including crab Benedict, country-fried steak and eggs, and ube pancakes. Lighter fare can be found nearby at **Toastique**, a recent arrival on Railroad Avenue that serves smoothies, gourmet toasts, cold-pressed juices, and more.

For breakfast like Mom used to make, look no further than **Denica's Real Food Kitchen** in Livermore, Dublin and most recently, Pleasanton, for

decadent favorites like waffles, omelets and giant cinnamon rolls.

Take your morning meal to the next level at **The Press** cafe in Pleasanton and Livermore. Sample tasty dishes such as an avocado and egg toastini, bacon cheese grits with pickled jalapeño or coconut chia pudding. Work on your Great American Novel over a mug brewed from Chromatic Coffee beans.

BRUNCHING OUT

Open early on weekends, Mayflower Restaurant in Dublin creates a transporting experience with its inviting atmosphere and authentic dim sum menu. If you're feeling adventurous, head over to Blossom Bee, also in Dublin. The Thai fusion creperie puts a twist on breakfast food in such dishes as the Dublin Rancheros crepe with grilled chicken and scrambled eggs.

Baci Bistro & Bar, in downtown Pleasanton, specializes in steak, seafood and Italian fare, but the weekend brunch menu is something special. Try the fried egg avocado toast or steak tostadas. Pleasanton's Nonni's Bistro, an openair, European-style eatery, serves breakfast and weekend brunch—giving plentiful takes on the first meal of the day.

Danville recently welcomed **Aracely Lounge**, which offers an impressive seasonal brunch menu that includes olive oil waffles with a medley of stone fruit and whipped yogurt.

EASY DOES IT

With its homey menu and refined decor, **Tri Valley Bistro** on Pleasanton's Main Street is the perfect spot to unwind. Indulge in a glass of wine as you sample the delicious New American cuisine. Also in Pleasanton, don't miss out on chef Maurice Dissels' exquisite paella dishes or Caribbean tacos at **Oyo** or the elevated crepes highlighting traditional and inventive flavors at **Bocado: Un Petit Bistro**.

For a flavorful culinary adventure, Livermore's family-owned **Posada Alta Cocina** is a solid bet. A contemporary take on Southwestern food, Posada is a great lunch stop before an afternoon of wine tasting.

Danville Harvest has earned a lot of buzz over the years—and deservedly so. Embracing the farm-to-table concept, the charming restaurant serves a delicious menu centered on seasonal ingredients. For a well-crafted slice

in downtown Danville, try the artisan pies at Romana Pizzeria.

Lunch in style at Pleasanton's Oasis Wine Lounge. The exotic space, with glam accents and an inviting patio, is ideal for dining à deux or with a group. The Mediterranean menu with a modern flair includes lamb lollipops, pumpkin borani, gyros and kebabs.

Opened in 1997, **Blue Agave Club** was the first restaurant in Pleasanton to showcase Mexican cuisine. More than 25 years later, the popular spot is well-known for its 100% blue agave tequila margaritas as well as its enchanting outdoor dining experience.

Demiya is a welcome addition to the Dublin dining scene, dishing out Japanese curry, udon, *katsu* and more in an airy, fast-casual space on Village Parkway.

POWER LUNCH

For authentic Southeast Asian cuisine, Experience Burma in Pleasanton has got you covered. Dining family style is recommended—and the best way to sample multiple dishes—so grab some friends and dig into the pumpkin pork stew or lemongrass tofu. In Livermore, Uncle Yu's at the Vineyard's remarkable wine list perfectly complements Szechuan staples and delectable dim sum, while Cafe Calamari serves Mediterranean fare with a focus on fresh seafood.

Break up your day with a culinary journey to Myanmar. Top dishes on the robust Burmese menu at **Burma! Burma!** in Dublin include tea leaf salad, garlic noodles, and pork and vegetable curries. Try the black sticky rice for dessert.

If you like some action with your meal, try **Da Boccery** in Livermore. In addition to its menu featuring pizzas, sandwiches and salads, the eatery offers bocce courts, shuffleboard and axe throwing, among other fun games.

Prefer to kick back and relax? **Danville Brewing Co.** is your spot. The restaurant boasts exceptional pub food as well as award-winning beers like 925 Blonde and Chux Double IPA.

THE BIG MEAL

THE REGION'S DINING SCENE INCLUDES EXCITING NEW RESTAURANTS AND POPULAR STANDARDS—OFFERING COSMOPOLITAN CUISINE TO PAIR WITH LIVERMORE VALLEY'S MANY FINE WINES.

THE CLASSICS

The Tri-Valley has its share of trusted eateries, including **Terra Mia Ristorante Italiano** in Livermore, which serves authentic Italian fare in a welcoming space. Another Livermore standout is **Range Life**. The Michelin-rated restaurant is located in a restored 1800s carriage house—mixing urban and rustic sensibilities in food and atmosphere. The changing menu highlights fresh regional ingredients, while a selection from its excellent list of creative craft cocktails will help round out an evening on the town.

Pleasanton's 1950s steak house **Hap's Original** allows for dining in style and comfort. While steak is most definitely the focus here, with the finest dry-aged cuts of beef, the house-made sauces and dressings help elevate already scrumptious dishes. For a deep-dish experience in Pleasanton, look no further than **Zachary's Chicago Pizza**; the local mainstay adds a Californian touch to the beloved Chicago-style pie.

Bridges Restaurant & Bar is a paragon in the Danville culinary world, but classic doesn't mean stuffy. The polished restaurant, which was featured as a location in the 1993 comedy *Mrs. Doubtfire*, has maintained its buzzy status by fine-tuning its California cuisine with European and Asian influences.

WORLDLY WONDERS

Sophistication is on the menu at Danville's **Zaya Thai Pantry**, as demonstrated by the restaurant's striking decor and food that is as impeccably presented as it is cooked. Another new-ish addition to the town's Thai scene is **Bungalow on Rose**, with its homey interior and excellent food that focuses on coastal cuisine.

Livermore's **Cured**: **Fish Bar** is a modern oasis that serves seafood-centric Japanese small plates with a California spin. The minimalist space includes custom wood accents and a bar overlooking the raw fish action.

Ultrafresh sushi and high-end Japanese fare can be found at **Amakara** in Dublin, where chef Eddy Imano takes as much pride in his colorful presentations as he does in his tempting rolls.

Bow down to **The Duchess** in Pleasanton. The cosmopolitan menu has a European flair, and includes entrées such as risotto with black truffle, mushrooms and English peas, and brown butter shrimp lobster ravioli.

HOT SPOTS

Dublin's **Berevino** specializes in old-world Italian cuisine; it's a great place to have a romantic dinner or sip reds and nosh pizza with a big group of friends.

The team behind Forbes Mill Steakhouse has found inspiration in the ocean with **Tides** in downtown Danville. The menu includes oysters, whole fish dishes and aquatic-themed





cocktails. Try the perfectly tender King Ora Salmon or well-spiced crab cakes. Newer to the neighborhood is **Isola Osteria**, a Railroad Avenue spot that crackles with the Sicilian-infused buzz of its owner, Angelo D'Alo. Menu items rotate with the seasons, but you'll always find good energy.

Celebrity chef Sanjeev Kapoor offers outstanding gastronomic tours of India at **The Yellow Chilli** in Danville and **The Essence–Redefining Indian Food** in Livermore. The restaurants exude an elegant atmosphere, and the food is equally noteworthy. For small plates and craft cocktails, don't be afraid of **The Black Cat** in Livermore, or try **Revel Kitchen & Bar** in Danville. The upscale tavern has been a smash with city sophisticates and features bar bites as well as heartier entrées and can't-miss desserts.

Sabio on Main, recognized by the Michelin Guide, has become a go-to spot in Pleasanton thanks to its delectable dishes and large bar. Treat yourself to chef Francis Hogan's tasting menu for the ultimate dining experience. Hogan and his partners also recently opened **Crush'd Wine Bar** + **Kitchen** in Danville, with a seasonal menu featuring local food purveyors and 24 wines on tap.

Elia is another stylish eatery in Pleasanton. The restaurant's thoughtful takes on Mediterranean favorites such as grilled octopus and moussaka are served on the spacious patio or in the open, airy dining room that feels as refreshing as a breeze from the Aegean Sea.

Tucked into Livermore's downtown district, **Sons of Liberty Alehouse** stands out. The menu is typical of gastropubs, but the execution is a cut above—with main courses that include some unusual complementary sides and take full advantage of seasonal ingredients.

IN GOOD TASTE

CHEF FRANCIS HOGAN CRAFTS A PERFECT RECIPE FOR SUSTAINABILITY AND CULINARY ARTISTRY.

Francis Hogan knows how to think big. Not only does the chef behind Sabio on Main (and soon-to-open sports bar Pivot) in Pleasanton and Crush'd Wine Bar + Kitchen in Danville draw inspiration from his world travels, he also prioritizes sustainability in his restaurants.

Sabio on Main has been a dining destination in the Tri-Valley for nearly a decade, earning Michelin Guide and *Wine Spectator* recognition; it was also named a Good Food 100 Restaurant for its commitment to both social/environmental responsibility and culinary craftsmanship.

That dual purpose is uniquely spotlighted at Crush'd, which features regionally sourced ingredients and 24 wines on tap. "By getting wines on tap, you can enjoy them at the proper temperature, with minimal oxygen exposure or light mishandling—which can deteriorate the wine," says Hogan. The tap system also cuts down on waste, keeping corks, wires and glass out of the landfill. "The environmental impact is dramatically different when you compare traditional wine service out of a bottle to that out of a recycled keg."

Hogan and his partners leaned on relationships built at Sabio over the years to partner with wineries on exclusive keg offerings. Such long-term collaborations are reflected in Crush'd's menu of small plates, tartines and artisan cheese and meat boards using ingredients from California purveyors such as Livermore olive ranch, Olivina. "Working with these small producers allows us to get our hands on what we feel are top-tier products that haven't been industrialized," says Hogan.

The access that Tri-Valley restaurants have to such exceptional, locally sourced ingredients is a major draw for visitors, according to Hogan. "We have incredible cities with awesome culture, and we are in an area that is robust with natural products. You can taste the freshness in our food."

PLAY IT COOL

SAMPLE THE TREATS ON THE TRI-VALLEY ICE CREAM TRAIL.

> Start your tour at Danville's Lottie's Creamery. The locally based sweetshop serves ice cream made in-house from fresh, seasonal ingredients. Look for cool treats in creative flavors such as milk tea and biscuits, pear prosecco sorbet, tiramisu toffee crunch and honey peanut butter brickle. Sundaes, ice-cream cakes and floats are also on the tempting menu.



- > Pleasanton's **Almare Gelato** makes its gelato fresh in-store every day, providing exceptional scoops in traditional flavors such as pistachio, amaretto and vanilla bean. Founder Alberto Malvestio, a native of Treviso in Northern Italy, created Almare's more unusual offerings including toasted almond and caramelized figs and lavender and fresh blueberries.
- > For a spot promising the "finest all-natural ice cream in the world," visit **Kwality Ice Cream** in Dublin, where specialties include eggless ice-cream cakes, sugar-free scoops, and kulfi (an Indian frozen dessert) in flavors such as kesari *pista* (think pistachio with a touch of saffron) and mango. You can also try cassata: three layers of ice cream topping a slice of sponge cake.
- > Dig into old-fashioned treats at **Loard's** in Livermore. The creamery has been scooping up cones since 1950, and proudly proclaims it hasn't changed its ice cream recipe during those 70-plus years. Flavors run the gamut from traditional—chocolate, vanilla and butter brickle—to slightly more modern takes such as ube, sea salt caramel and green tea.
- > Take a drive to Pleasanton's iconic **Meadowlark Dairy**, California's first certified dairy. Founded in the early 1900s, it is a nostalgic throwback to the days of local milk shops. Try a cone of Meadowlark's signature soft serve ice cream, and stay tuned for a new location in Livermore opening this year.




TREATYOURSELF RIGHT



To satisfy a different kind of sweet tooth, stop by Livermore's Wingen Bakery, and pick up a fig pop tart or orange-spiced coffee cake. For more decadent delicacies, visit Old Towne Danville Bakery. This long-standing shop does everything from cakes to cookies. A more recent Danville option is Maison Benoit, where you'll find French desserts, pastries and breads. Excellent éclairs, cannolis and macarons are some of the European goodies at Primrose Bakery in Pleasanton. Or head to Dublin bakery Tous les Jours, which serves up slices of cake that are so aesthetically pleasing it's difficult to eat them. But not too difficult, because they taste even better than they look.

The wines of Livermore Valley have a long history of making their mark, starting with Cresta Blanca Winery taking the grand prize at the Paris Exposition in 1889 (see sidebar for additional Livermore Valley wine facts).

The Livermore Valley brought home 201 awards from the 2024 San Francisco Chronicle Wine Competition, the largest competition of North American wines in the world. Las Positas Vineyards was named the Best White Wine Sweepstakes Winner for its 2023 verdelho. Almost Famous Wine Company, Darcie Kent Estate Winery and Wine Without Borders got Best of Class awards, while Livermore Valley AVA members earned 26 double gold and 57 gold awards.



Wente Vineyards has been a family affair since German immigrant Carl Wente first purchased land in the Livermore Valley in 1883; in fact, it is the oldest continuously operated family winery in the United States.

Now, the fifth generation of Wente winegrowers are helping guide the business into the future. Niki, who got her start in the industry as a harvest intern at age 14, says the entire family is committed to cementing Wente's place in Livermore Wine Country.

DANVILLE BREWING CO. HEAD BREWER MATT SAGER CELEBRATES BEER-MAKING IN THE TRI-VALLEY.

Although the Tri-Valley is known for its top-quality wines, the area is also a hot spot for top-quality craft brews. "The East Bay beer scene is the best beer scene in California, including the up-and-coming Tri-Valley," says Matt Sager.

And he would know. Sager has been the head brewer at Danville Brewing Co. in downtown since the restaurant and brewery debuted on Railroad Avenue in 2016. The establishment quickly became a popular destination, beloved by locals and visitors drawn to its robust food menu and award-winning beers.

Now, Sager and Danville Brewing owners Marcus Maita and Randy Negi are planning a second location in Pleasanton (the opening date is still TBD) that will include a 30-barrel production facility, taproom and beer garden.

"We realized early on that we had outgrown our space; we didn't have the capacity to brew enough beer to satisfy everyone who wanted it," says Sager. "The new facility will allow us to produce more of our core beers, but also play around with styles we can't do with only four fermenters at the current location. My assistant brewer, Sebastian Broemel, and I are always evolving our recipes, and I am really excited to dive into this next phase of Danville Brewing."

Another appealing aspect of the Pleasanton expansion is its proximity to Livermore stalwarts such as Altamont Beer Works.


"The brewing industry here is awesome. It is less of a competition and more of a fellowship. We help each other out," says Sager. "We'll continue to brew stylistically clean, fantastic beers in the hopes we can attract more people and more breweries to our area."


2. THE WEEKEND WARRIOR (MODERATE)


The views from atop **Pleasanton Ridge Regional Park** are breathtaking—literally. The hike from the Foothill Staging Area, located just off Interstate 680, up to the Thermalito Trail and the Ridgeline Trail is a bit of a climb but worth the sweat. The Castleridge Trailhead allows for exploration of the northern ridgeline of the park—after a steep climb, of course. *ebparks.org/parks/Pleasanton*

If you want a round with a view, it's hard to beat **The Course at Wente Vineyards** in Livermore. Grapevines and oak-dotted hills flank the Greg Norman–designed course, where golfers encounter plenty of challenges and thrills. Overlooking the tricky 18th hole, The Grill has a casual menu and full bar. wentevineyards.com/golf

For more great risk/reward play, head to the back nine at Pleasanton's **Callippe Preserve Golf Course**. The greens are complex, so be sure to treat yourself with a visit to the Vista Restaurant, which offers sandwiches, burgers and a view of the surrounding nature preserve. *playcallippe.com*

Rees Jones designed the gorgeous **Poppy Ridge** on 3,000 acres in Livermore, with a driving range and nine-hole course. Afterward, take in the scenery over lunch at The Grill. *poppyridgegolf.com*

The nine-hole course at **Pleasanton Golf Center** at the Alameda County Fairgrounds is suited to all abilities and budgets. Perfect your swing at the facility's nearby driving range and recharge at the clubhouse, which serves salads, sandwiches and beverages. *pleasantongolfcenter.com*


DEL VALLE REGIONAL PARK

BLACKHAWK MUSEUM

The main event at this Danville establishment is a rotating fleet of iconic cars. Other sections spotlight the Old West, China's rich history, a collection of fine makeup compacts and African art; the *World of Nature* exhibit focuses on the planet's diverse species and ecosystems. *blackhawkmuseum.org*

DUBLIN CAMP PARKS MILITARY HISTORY CENTER

This museum-quality history center offers visitors the opportunity to learn about the Camp Parks military base that helped transform Dublin from a rural community into the dynamic city it is today. *dublin.ca.gov/1916*

DUBLIN HERITAGE PARK & MUSEUMS

Clustered on 10 acres, a Craftsman house, a simple white church, a schoolhouse and a cemetery tell the story of the Tri-Valley in the 1800s and early 1900s. In the school, interactive exhibits reflect the region's history, and a playhouse allows for make-believe. Walking tours, enhanced by the recent

addition of an Otocast audio guide, provide insights into Dublin's past. *dublin.ca.gov/269*

EUGENE O'NEILL NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

Eugene O'Neill, the only American playwright to win a Nobel Prize, reached the peak of his powers at Danville's Tao House, which he built on 158 bucolic acres in 1937 and where he lived through 1944. Here, he wrote Long Day's Journey into Night and The Iceman Cometh, among other masterworks. Tao House is now a museum where you can view O'Neill's desk, manuscripts and photos; in September, the Eugene O'Neill Festival presents exciting live performances. nps.gov/euon, eugeneoneill.org

Delve into Pleasanton's past with artifacts and images of the Ohlone people, Spanish and Anglo settlers, World War II's expanding population, and today's dwellers. Additionally, the museum hosts free walking tours during the summer and early fall and the annual Ghost Walk, showcasing the town's most haunted sites every Halloween. *museumonmain.org*
